As I look back on this summer at Reformation, I'm reminded that every season God gives us is full of unique blessings. This summer was no exception it overflowed with worship, laughter, meals, memories, and the joy of being the church together.

Under the bright sun, we gathered for Youth Sunday, where our young people led, preached, and shared their voices in worship. In their leadership, we caught a glimpse of God's promise that the Church is alive and in good hands for generations to come. We surrounded Micah Hobart with blessings and Godspeed as he set out on his year-long journey with Young Adults in Global Mission to Mexico. Just as Paul wrote to the Philippians, *"I thank my God every time I remember you... because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now"* (Philippians 1:3–5), we give thanks for Micah's call to serve and represent Christ's love in a new place. We washed in the summer rains with the celebration of baptisms, rejoicing as God claimed baby Brooks as His own and welcomed him into the body of Christ. We opened our arms to eleven new members, each bringing their own gifts, stories, and faith to our community.

In the sway of the warmth, I joined you at family BBQs and under the sparkle of fireworks. I sat at tables breaking bread with our college young adults before they returned to their campuses, sending them off with prayer. I gathered with colleagues and siblings in Christ at Synod Assembly, where together we discerned and voted to call a new bishop a reminder that the Holy Spirit still moves and leads in the wider Church.

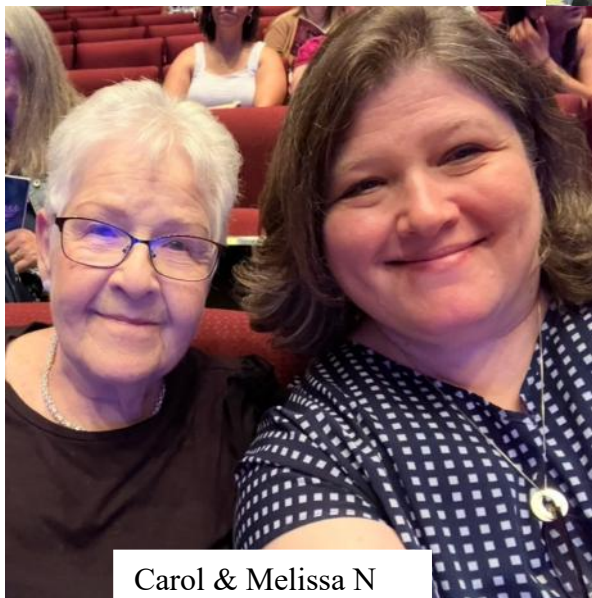

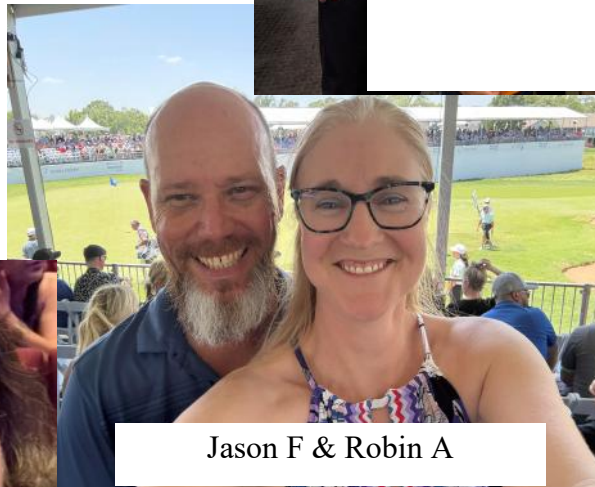

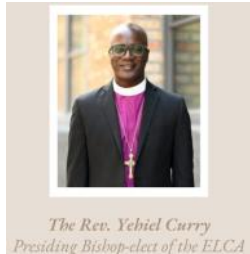

Historic ELCA Election



At the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix, Rev. Yehiel Curry was elected Presiding Bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, becoming the first Black person and first of African descent to hold the denomination's highest office. Shortly after, Rev. Lucille "CeCee" Mills was elected ELCA Secretary, also making history as the first Black person to serve in that role. Both leaders begin six-year terms, marking a significant milestone in the church.

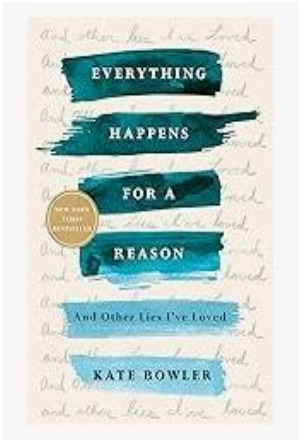
Pancakes, patterns, and plenty of yarn talk!

Despite strong giving so far this year (slightly ahead of last year), we continue to lag behind our conservatively developed budget by \$18,525. We had hoped to make up a little more ground by this point in the year; however, we realize that some of the variance is due to the timing of annual giving. We continue to ask members to prayerfully consider their financial support as we carry out the mission of Reformation Lutheran Church.
